The word limit should be **4000- 5000** words and must be adhered to strictly. The rules of referencing and plagiarism are given in the attachment.

RULES OF REFERENCING AND PLAGIARISM

- **Public Domain Books:** Regarding the referencing from books, the general rule in India is that copyright lasts for 60 years, counted from the year following the death of the author. In the case of photographs, posthumous publications, anonymous and pseudonymous publications, works of government and works of international organizations, the 60-year period is counted from the date of publication. Therefore, unless it is specifically mentioned that the book is in the public domain, it is advisable to quote/refer the author/book in the text.
- **Quoting:** Definitions/ sections (not exceeding 40-50 words) can be quoted verbatim from any book with proper references.
- **References/Bibliography:** For the references/bibliography section, you can either provide name/date citations for references and include the reference details at the end of the chapter/book or they can be provided as footnotes/endnotes using the insert footnote or endnote tool in Word to link them. It is preferred that there be either footnotes or endnotes (not both) in the text.

We would also like to draw your attention to the issue of plagiarism. NAPSIPAG stands firmly against publication of plagiarized material. We encourage our prospective authors to provide original works and contribute to the pool of quality and authentic resources available. Please visit www.plagiarism.org to familiarize yourself with the issue and ways of avoiding any inadvertent slippage. Kindly note that in case any of the material in your article is found to be plagiarized, we would have to reject the proposal, regardless of the stage the manuscript is in the publication process.
